2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>The college has a multidimensional approach to enhance the teaching-learning process. ICT tools are used by Teachers on a regular basis to make teaching interesting. Focus is placed on experiential learning by conducting activities in the classroom, industry as well as community followed by discussions. Seminar presentation by students develops an attitude of scientific inquiry at the graduate and postgraduate level. Field visits are organized to expose students to "on the job" environment. Each course work has an evaluation pattern which is subject specific and has a defined rubric keeping in mind the learning outcomes. Internal Quality Assurance Committee nurtures quality culture in teaching - learning process, structures and methodologies of execution and learning outcomes in the institute by way of various quality initiatives, strategies, and policies.</p> <p>Due to educational technology, we adapted instructional strategies that deviated from the conventional classroom setting. The syllabus was completed by making online learning opportunities that were equally accessible as in-person instruction. The implementation of a hybrid educational paradigm ensured that no course material is missed by the pupils. Resources were considered for each course and prepared accordingly while creating the syllabus and deciding which lessons will be held in person and online. In a hybrid learning environment, some students attended classes in person while others participated digitally from their homes. Educators used tools like video conferencing to teach both in-person and distant pupils at the same time. Hybrid classes occasionally included learning elements like video conferencing online exercises and pre-recorded video instruction, to support face-to-face classroom sessions. Students were also provided with mobile learning options for the online portion. We were open to feedback and learning from student's experiences. Care was taken to see to it that the students were not overload on online assignments.</p> <p>Expectations for coursework, participation, and assessments to both in-person and online students was very clearly communicated. A variety of teaching methods, such as lectures, discussions, group work, and individual assignments, were used to accommodate the needs of all students and increase student participation. Support and resources were provided, including additional office hours for tutoring, online study and access to necessary study materials. Students were mentored through individual or group meetings on online mode.</p> <p>Technology was used to the optimum level to facilitate learning, such as video conferencing, online collaborative tools, and learning management systems. Regular assessment of progress was done and feedback provided through a variety of assessment methods.</p>
