**Report and Analysis of Student's Feedback of Curriculum
2022-2023**

Feedback was collectively obtained from the students as stakeholders from all the Specializations of the Sir Vithaldas Thackersey College of Home Science (Empowered Autonomous Status). An online questionnaire was administered via the MIS system. It covered all the questions with respect to all the components of curriculum development and outcomes. The respondents were expected to rate the components based on a three-point Likert scale ranging from Strongly agree, Agree and Disagree. A total of 244 responses obtained from First year and Second year undergraduate students were collected from various departments and analysed accordingly. The findings were as follows:

Not even a single student disagreed to the query that curriculum fosters development of skills required to work as a professional in clinical set up/community set up thereby confirming it and 98.4% of the students upheld the opinion that the curriculum fosters development of skills required to work in an industry set up. 99.2% of students asserted that considerable importance is given to development of entrepreneurship skills as well as doing research-oriented activities aiding in build-up of scientific temperament; however, only 84.8% of the students agreed to the question on curriculum enabling creativity and ability to innovate.
