Rules for Entrance Examination

The students who are eligible to appear for the entrance examination for admission to MSc (Specialized Dietetics) and MSc (Exercise Science and Sports Nutrition) are hereby notified that the entrance examination is scheduled on Saturday, 15th June 2024.

The details of the format, marks distribution, and schedule of the examination are provided below:

- 1. Total marks- 100
- 2. Exam Duration 2 hours 15 minutes
- 3. Mode of examination- On campus (offline) at Sir Vithaldas Thackersey College of Home Science (Empowered Autonomous Status), SNDT Women's University, Juhu Campus, Mumbai
- 4. Format: Objective type (MCQs only) 100 questions of 1 mark each.
 - a) Part A 60 marks (common to both specializations)- Human Physiology and Nutritional Biochemistry, General Nutrition, Nutrition across life cycle, Functional Foods, Food Science, Public Health Nutrition, Research Methods and Statistics.
 - b) Part B 40 marks (specific to specializations)- either Basic and Therapeutic dietetics for MSc (Specialized Dietetics) or Exercise Physiology and Sports Nutrition for MSc (Exercise Science and Sports Nutrition).
- 5. The list of students for online interviews will be prepared based on academic aggregates and entrance examination scores. The schedule and meeting links for the interview will be will be displayed on the college website and also emailed to eligible students.
- 6. Admission offer will be given as per eligibility criteria, and academic merit (based on marks obtained in undergraduate courses, entrance examination, and personal interview).

Note- The admission offer provided to the students will be provisional until they have submitted their sixth-semester mark sheet. The college can cancel the admission if the selected student does not clear any course in the sixth semester
